Getting started

The topics in this section will introduce you to your tablet, help you get set up with service, provide an overview of the tablet screen, and get you started with basic tablet operations.

Getting to know your tablet



Note: Your tablet's screens and app layouts are subject to change. This user guide uses sample images only.


Part	Description		
Power key	 Turn tablet on: Press and hold the Power key. Turn tablet off: Press the Power key and Volume up key at the same time. Turn screen on/off: Press the Power key. Capture screenshot: Press the Power key and Volume down key at the same time. 		
Volume keys	Adjust the volume for media, notifications, and system sounds.		
Microphone	Transmit your voice electronically for voice recording or Google Assistant.		
Front camera	Take pictures and record videos while facing the screen.		
SIM and microSD™ tray	Insert your Nano SIM card and microSD card (sold separately) for service and additional storage.		
USB Type-C	Connect the USB cable (included) for charging or to connect other accessories.		
Headset port	rt Plug in a headset (sold separately) to listen to music.		
Speaker	Listen to music and automated prompts.		
Touch screen	View information needed to operate your tablet.Access your tablet's features and applications.		
Back cameras	 Take pictures and record videos. Use features such as the beauty mode, slow motion, time lapse, motion photo, and more. 		
Flash	Brighten photos taken indoors or at night.Use as a flashlight to see in dark areas.


Setup

Install a Nano SIM/microSD card

1. Insert the included SIM pin to eject the SIM tray.




2. Place or remove the Nano SIM card and microSD™ card with the metal contacts facing down into the tray. Gently slide the SIM tray back into the slot.



Note: MicroSD™ cards are sold separately. The Celero5G Tab accepts cards up to 1TB in capacity.

Charge the battery

 Connect one end of the data cable to the USB port located on the right side of your tablet.



- 2. Connect the other end to the power adapter.
- 3. Connect the power adapter to an electrical outlet to fully charge your tablet.

Note: Use the power adapter that comes with your tablet; using other adapters may damage your tablet.

Optimize your battery life

To optimize your battery life, you can make the following adjustments:

- Turn on power saving mode: Go to Settings > Battery > Battery Saver, and slide the Use Battery Saver switch to the On position.
- Lower screen brightness: Go to Settings > Display > Brightness level, and slide the brightness bar to the left.
- Screen timeout: Go to Settings > Display > Screen timeout, and select proper timeout duration.
- Optimized charging: Go to Settings > Battery > Optimized charging > On to let your tablet only charge up to 80% battery to help extend battery lifespan.
- Overcharge protection: Go to Settings > Battery > Overcharge protection >
 On to limit charge to 80% after 24 hours of continuous charging.

Turn your tablet on and off

The instructions below explain how to turn your tablet on and off.

Press and hold the **Power** key until the device turns on.

To turn your tablet off, choose one of the following ways:

- Press the Power key and the Volume up key at the same time, and tap Power off.




Complete the setup screens

Once your tablet is powered on, you will need to run Setup. The Setup Wizard will appear to guide you through the basic settings on your device.

Follow the instructions to finish your tablet setup.

If you choose **A child** on **Who's going to use this device** screen, you will be guided to create or sign in both child and parent Google Accounts, set up Family Link and configure Google Kids Space for your child.



Home screen

The Home screen is the starting point for your tablet's applications, functions, and menus. You can customize your Home screen by adding application icons, shortcuts, folders, and more.

Your Home screen extends beyond the initial screen. To add a new Home screen, drag an app icon to the right edge of the main screen and release the icon.



Notification and Quick Settings panel

- 1. Swipe down on the Status bar to open the Notification and Quick Settings panel.
- 2. Tap a notifications on the right side of the panel to view the notification details. Tap a settings on the left size of the panel to turn the settings on or off.
- 3. Swipe left or right on a notification to delete it, or tap **Clear all** to clear all event-based notifications (other ongoing notifications will remain).
- 4. You can tap **Settings** to access full settings, tap **Power off** to turn your tablet off, or tap to switch users.
- 5. To close the panel, swipe up or tap the **Back** button <




Making connections

The topics in this section will explain how to help you make connections, from maintaining contacts, to text messages, email, Internet, and international services.

Contacts

From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Contacts (2).



Add a contact

- 1. From the **Contacts** screen, tap + to add a contact.
- 2. Use the keyboard to enter information. When you are finished, tap Save.

Edit a contact

- 1. From the Contacts screen, tap a contact to view its details.
- 2. Tap Edit O on the top right corner of the screen.

Delete a contact

- 1. From the Contacts screen, tap a contact to view its details.
- 2. Scroll down on the contact details screen, and select **Delete**.

Share a contact

You can quickly share contacts using Bluetooth, Gmail, Google messages, etc.

- 1. From the Contacts screen, tap a contact to view its details.
- 2. Scroll down on the contact details screen, and select Share contact.
- 3. Select how you'd like to share the contact information card (vCard).

Contacts settings

On top right corner of the **Contacts** screen, tap ② or Google Account avatar when signed in > **Contacts settings** to adjust your contacts settings.

Messages

Send text and multimedia messages by pairing your mobile phone.

From the Home screen, tap Messages



Pair your mobile phone

You can pair your mobile phone by following two ways:

Pair with QR code

- 1. On your tablet, tap Pair with QR code. Your QR code appears.
- 2. On your phone, open the Google Messages app, tap ② on the top right corner of the screen and select Device pairing > QR code scanner to open the scanner. Scan the QR code on your tablet.
- 3. Your tablet will automatically pair with your phone.

Sign in your Google Account:

- 1. On your tablet, tap **Sign in** to sign in to your Google Account. An emoji shows up.
- 2. On your phone, open the **Google Messages** app, tap ② on the top right corner of the screen and select **Sign in** to sign in with the same Google Account. Tap the matching emoji that shows up on your tablet.
- 3. Your tablet will automatically pair with your phone.

Unpair your mobile phone

To unpair your mobile phone, tap on the top left corner of the tablet messages screen and select **Unpair**.

You can also tap ② on the top right corner of the phone messages screen and select **Device pairing** > tap X at the right side of the paired device.

Send a text message (SMS)

- 1. From the Messages screen, tap 🗘 Start chat .
- 2. Select a conversation and compose your message.
- 3. When done, tap **Send** to send the text message.

Note: Your text message automatically becomes a multimedia message if you enter an email address as the recipient, attach an item, or compose a long message (over 160 characters).

Send a multimedia message (MMS)

- 1. From the Messages screen, tap Start chat.
- 2. Select a conversation and compose your message.
- 3. You can tap 😉 to insert an emoji, tap 🛂 to send a sticker, tap 💷 to send a GIF file, and tap 🖳 to attach a file (image, audio, video, etc.).
- 4. After adding attachments, you can tap to view it, and tap

 ★ to delete the attachment.
- 5. Tap **Send** to send the MMS message.

Finding image and video attachments

Images and video attachments in MMS messages are typically stored in the Pictures folder, often in a file within Pictures called Messages or Downloads.

You can also find images and video in your tablet's Gallery or Photos app.

To ensure the image or video attachment is saved to your device, you might need to long-press the attachment in the message and select either the "Save" or "Download" option.

Messages settings

Tap on the top of the Messages screen and tap **Settings** to adjust your messages settings.

Gmail™

Use Gmail to send, receive, and manage your email messages. Before using Gmail, you must sign into your Google Account on your tablet. From the Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps** and tap **Gmail** (M).

Note: You can use the Gmail app to manage email for other accounts, such as Hotmail, Outlook, Exchange, and more.

Receive an email

When a new email is received, you will see in the Status bar. Drag the Status bar down to display the Notification panel and tap the new message to view it.

Compose an email

- 1. From the Gmail screen, tap / compose a new email message.
- 2. Enter the message recipient(s), subject, and message, and then tap **Send** .

Email settings

You can access settings for the Gmail app and for your individual email accounts from the Gmail settings menu.

- 1. From the Gmail screen, tap \equiv > **Settings**.
- 2. Tap General settings to access settings for all accounts, or tap an account name to configure settings for a specific email account.

Internet and social networking

The following topics describe how to connect to and use the Internet on your tablet and how to access popular social networking sites.

Chrome browser

From the Home screen, tap **Chrome** to browse the Internet, search for information, and bookmark your favorite web pages for convenient access.

Browsing web pages

- 1. Tap the address field.
- 2. Enter a web address or a keyword to browse for web pages.

Adding a bookmark

- 1. Open the web page you want to bookmark.
- 2. Tap on the top right corner of the screen.

Opening a bookmark

- 1. From the Chrome browser screen, tap > Bookmarks.
- 2. Select the bookmark of the website you want to view.

Customizing browser settings

- 1. From the Chrome browser screen, tap > Settings.
- In the Settings list, you can select options to customize the browser.

Tip: For more information, visit: google.com/chrome.

Facebook

Post updates, see what your friends are up to, upload pictures and check-ins, and more with on-the-go Facebook access.

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps** and tap **Facebook** .



- Enter your mobile number or email and password and tap Log In, or tap Create new account to join Facebook.
- 3. Once completed, your Facebook account will be added to your tablet.

Once you've either created an account or signed in, you can post and view updates, upload pictures, tag locations, and more, all from your tablet.

From the **Facebook** screen, tap **What's on your mind?** to type an update. You can also share photos and videos, start a live video, scroll through your Facebook feed, and more.

YouTube

View videos uploaded to YouTube and upload your own videos.

- 1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps** and tap **YouTube** .
- 2. Browse YouTube channels and tap a video to view.
- 3. The video will play on your tablet screen. Tap the screen to pause or resume play while watching.

You can post videos to your YouTube account from your tablet.

- 1. Tap Record/Post Video +.
- Select a video to upload, record a new video to upload, or stream a live video.Enter a title, description, and tags, and select a privacy setting.

Connectivity

The following topics address your tablet's connectivity options, including USB file transfer, Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, and more.

USB

You can use the USB cable to connect your tablet directly to your computer and transfer music, photos, and other content files.

- 1. Connect your tablet to your computer using the USB cable.
- Swipe the Status bar down to display the Notification panel and tap Charging this device via USB.
- 3. Tap File Transfer. You can also select other options available.
- 4.On your computer, navigate to the detected device and open it.
- 5. If available, select a drive (Internal shared storage or SD card).
- 6. Select a folder and copy files from your computer to your tablet or from your tablet to your computer. When done, disconnect your tablet from your computer.

Wi-Fi

To use your tablet's Wi-Fi, you need access to a wireless access point or hotspot.

- 1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Settings (3).
- 2. Tap Network & internet > Internet.

- 3. Slide the Wi-Fi switch to the **On** position to enable Wi-Fi.
- 4. Tap a Wi-Fi network to connect, enter the password (if applicable), and then tap Connect.
- 5. Your tablet will be connected to the Wi-Fi network. You will see 🔷 in the status

Bluetooth

- 1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps** and tap **Settings** (3).
- 2. Tap Connected devices > Connection preferences > Bluetooth.
- 3. Slide the Bluetooth switch to the On
 position.

Pair Bluetooth devices

- 1. From the Connected devices screen, tap Pair new device.
- 2. Tap a device under Available devices and follow the on-screen instructions to pair with the device.
- 3. You can now tap a paired device to connect.

To forget a paired device

- 1. From the Connected devices screen, tap **Settings** (a) next to the device you wish to forget.
- 2. Tap Forget > Forget device.
- 3. The device will be unpaired from your tablet.

Share files via Bluetooth

You can use Bluetooth to transfer files between your tablet and another Bluetoothenabled device, such as a phone or computer. Send photos, videos, calendar events, contacts, and more.

Apps and entertainment

The topics in this section will explore the features that make your tablet so much more than a tablet, from the BoostMax Audio™ to camera, photos, and more.

BoostMax Audio

To access BoostMax Audio, you can choose one of the following ways:


- From the Home screen, tap BoostMax Audio ().

The Continue Watching row lets you easily resume the show you were watching last night. If you're in the mood for something new, Entertainment Space will provide personalized and trending recommendation rows from Google TV, Twitch, Hulu and many additional services.

With the **Games** tab, find fun and adventure with Google Play Games. The Continue Playing row lets you continue games where you left off and select games are available for Instant play, so you can try a game before downloading it.

The **Read** tab showcases a wide selection from Google Play Books. You can find audiobooks in this section, too. Enjoy free sneak peeks before buying, books with discounted prices and recommendations based on your tastes or current trends.







Take a photo

- From the Home screen, tap Camera . You can also access the Camera with one of the following methods:
 - From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Camera
 - Press the Power key twice quickly.
 - From the Lock screen, swipe up from the bottom right corner of the screen.
- 2. Tap **Photo** to switch to Photo mode.
- 3. Aim the camera at your subject and tap or press the **Volume** key to take the photo.

Record a video

- 1. From the Camera screen, tap Video to switch to Video mode.
- 2. Aim the camera at your subject and tap or press the **Volume** key to start recording a video.
- 3. Tap to hold the recording and tap to resume. Tap to stop recording and save your video. To take a picture during the recording, tap .


Camera settings

You can adjust your camera's settings using the icons on the main camera screen and the full camera settings menu.

- 1. From the Home screen, tap Camera 👩
- 2. Tap **Settings (6)**

Photos

Using the **Photos** (app, you can view photos and watch videos that you've taken, downloaded, or copied onto your storage card or tablet memory. For pictures that are on your storage card or tablet memory, you can do basic editing such as rotating and cropping.



Edit photos

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps** and tap **Photos** (2).



- 2. Tap the picture you want to edit.
- 3. Tap 🔁 to access the Edit screen.
- 4. When finished, tap Save copy to save a copy of your photo.

Productivity

Use your tablet to stay productive and organized with calendar, navigation, alarm, office, and more productivity apps.

Calendar

Use the Calendar to create and manage events, meetings, and appointments.

From the Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps** and tap **Calendar** (10). You can view calendar in Schedule. Day. 3 days. Week, or Month view.

Add an event

- 1. From the Calendar screen, tap **Add** + to add an event.
- 2. Enter event details, and then tap Save.

Edit an event

- 1. From the Calendar screen, tap a date and an event to view the details.
- 2. Tap Edit / to edit the event and tap Save to save.

Delete an event

- 1. From the Calendar screen, tap a date and an event to view the details.
- 2. Tap **Options** > **Delete** to delete the event.

Calendar settings

- 1. From the Calendar screen, tap \equiv > Settings > General.
- 2. Tap an option to adjust Calendar settings.

Google Maps

Explore and navigate your world with Google Maps. Find places you'll love, connect with businesses you're interested in, and get around with real-time traffic information.

Search for destinations

Use Google Maps to locate and map a specific address or destination.

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps** and tap **Maps** (?).



- 2. Tap **Search here**.
- 3. Enter an address, city, facility name, etc., then choose a search result. You will see your location on the map.

Google Maps operations

- View current location: Tap to find your current location on the map.
- Explore nearby venue categories: Tap Explore 💜 to browse nearby venues by selecting a category such as restaurants, parks, hotels, and more.

- Select map types for different views: Tap Map Type 😂 and choose your map view, or select to view map details such as traffic, street view, etc.
- Find a route to your destination: Tap GO 📀, enter your desired start location and destination, and tap a method of transportation (car, public transit, or on foot) for a list of step-by-step directions to your destination.

Clock

The Clock app allows you to set alarms, view different world times, use a stopwatch, set a timer, manage your bedtime, and use your tablet as a desk clock.

From the Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps** and tap **Clock** .



Set the date and time manually

- 1. From the Clock screen, tap > Settings > Change date & time > Set time automatically, slide the switch to the Off oposition.
- 2. Tap **Set date** or **Set time** to set the date or time manually.

Create a new alarm

- 1. Tap **Alarm** (3) > +
- 2. Set the time for the alarm and tap OK.

World clock

- 1. Tap Clock (1) > + to access the World clock screen.
- 2. Type to enter a city name and select the city you want to add from the list. To remove a city, swipe the city to the left side.

Timer

- 1. Tap **Timer** to access the Timer screen.
- 2. Enter the amount of time into the Timer.
- 3. Tap to begin timing. Tap to pause it.
- 4. Tap (*) to reset the timer back to previous set time. Tap (*) to delete the timer. Tap ___ to add another timer. Swipe up and down to view other active timers.

Stopwatch

- 1. Tap **Stopwatch** to access the Stopwatch screen.
- 2. Tap to begin the stopwatch. Tap to stop it. Tap to reset the stopwatch to zero. Tap 🐧 to add lap splits.

Bedtime

- 1. Tap **Bedtime** (Eq.) to access the Bedtime screen.
- 2. Set your sleep time and wake-up time.

Your tablet will enter **Bedtime mode** during sleep time. In Bedtime mode, tablet notifications for calls, texts, and other interruptions will be turned off. And the tablet's display color will be turned into black and white to reduce the chance of you staying up and using your tablet. A wake up alarm will be set automatically to wake you up at the wake-up time you've set.

There are the following options for you to manage your sleep:

- See recent bedtime activity: Keep track of your screen time and see estimates
 of time spent in bed. This is based on when your tablet remained motionless in a
 dark room.
- Listen to sleep sounds: You can play soothing music to help you fall asleep. Sleep sounds don't play automatically.
- See your upcoming events: To make sure your alarm is set before any events, allow Clock to access your calendar.

Note: You can add **Bedtime mode** to the Quick Settings Panel to enable or disable this mode quickly and easily.

Useful settings

Languages

Set the language for the tablet's menus.

From the Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps** and tap **Settings** > **System** > **Languages**.

System languages

- 1. From the Languages screen, tap System languages.
- 2. View your languages.
 - When more than one language has been added, you can touch and hold the language, then drag it up to the first position to set as the default display language.
 - To add a language, tap Add a language, then select the language you want to add.
 - To remove a language, tap > Remove.

App languages

- 1. From the Languages screen, tap App languages.

Date & time

Time

Set the time manually. This option is available only when the Set time automatically function is disabled.

Automatic time zone

From the Date & time screen, slide the **Set automatically** switch to the **On** position to use network-provided time zone.

When Automatic time zone turned off, you can tap **Time zone** to manually select your time zone.

Use location

From the Date & time screen, slide the **Use location** switch to the **On O** position to use location to set the time zone.

Time zone

Manually select your time zone. This option is available only when the Automatic time zone function is disabled.

Use locale default

From the Date & time screen, slide the **Use locale default** switch to the **On O** position to use the default time format.

Use 24-hour format

From the Date & time screen, slide the **Use 24-hour format** switch to the **On O** position to enable the 24-hour time format.

Display

Use the tablet's Display settings menu to adjust items such as brightness, screen timeout, and more.

From the Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps** and tap **Settings** > **Display**.

Brightness level

- 1. From the Display screen, tap **Brightness level**.
- 2. Drag the slider to adjust the brightness level manually.

Adaptive brightness

- 1. From the Display screen, tap **Adaptive brightness**.
- 2. Slide the switch to the On Oposition to enable Adaptive brightness.
- 3. When turned on, your tablet will automatically adjust screen brightness based on the lighting conditions.

Lock screen

- 1. From the Display screen, tap Lock screen.
- 2. Manage what to show and when to show on the lock screen.

Screen timeout

1. From the Display screen, tap Screen timeout.

- Set screen timeout interval. Your screen will automatically go to sleep after the set amount of time.
- 3. You can slide the **Screen attention** switch to the **On O** position to prevent your screen from turning off if you're looking at it.

Dark theme

From the Display screen, slide the **Dark theme** switch to the **On (**O position to enable the dark theme.

Display size and text

- 1. From the Display screen, tap **Display size and text**.
- 2. Drag the sliders to adjust the font size and display size, slide the switches to enable bold text and high contrast text. You can also tap **Reset settings** to reset display size and text to tablet's original settings.

Night Light

From the Display screen, slide the **Night Light** switch to the **On O** position to enable Night Light. When enabled, you can set a Night Light schedule and intensity.

Color contrast

- 1. From the Display screen, tap Color contrast.
- 2. Choose the contrast that looks best fro you.

Auto-rotate screen

From the Display screen, slide the **Auto rotate screen** switch to the **On O** position to enable screen rotation.

Smooth Display

From the Display screen, slide the **Smooth Display** switch to the **On O** position to automatically raise the refresh rate from 60 to 90 HZ for some content. Enabling this function will increase battery drain.

Screen saver

From the Display screen, tap **Screen Saver** to set the screen saver, adjust screen saver settings.

Lift to wake

From the Display screen, slide the **Lift to wake** switch to the **On O** position to turn on the tablet display by simply lifting your tablet from a table or removing it from your pocket.

Wallpaper & style

From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Settings > Wallpaper & style.

Your Digital Wellbeing tools

From this menu, you can get info about how you spend time on your tablet, like how often you unlock it and how long you use each app. You can use that info to improve your digital wellbeing. For example, you can set app timers and schedule display

changes.

- · App limits: Set time limits for your apps.
- Bedtime mode: Set a bedtime schedule to disconnect from your tablet and avoid interruptions while you sleep.
- Focus mode: Pause distracting apps when you need time to focus.
- Screen time reminders: Get gentle reminders when you're spending a long time in an app.
